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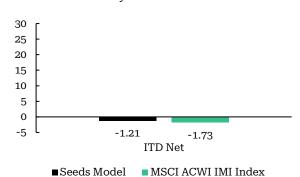

GLOSSARY

Dividend Yield: Dividend yield is the financial ratio that measures the quantum of cash dividends paid out to shareholders

relative to the market value per share. It is computed by dividing the dividend per share by the market price

per share and multiplying the result by 100.

Index Description: The MSCI ACWI Investable Market Index (IMI) captures large, mid and small cap representation across 23

Developed Markets (DM) and 24 Emerging Markets (EM) countries*. With 8,847 constituents, the index is

comprehensive, covering approximately 99% of the global equity investment opportunity set.

Market Capitalization: Market capitalization, often referred to as market cap, is a measure of the total value of a company's

outstanding shares of stock in the market. It provides an indication of the company's size and is calculated by multiplying the current market price per share by the total number of outstanding shares. The number is weighted by each stocks weight in the model, then summed together to get that weighted average market

capitalization.

Price/Earnings (P/E): The price to earnings ratio (P/E) is a fundamental measure used to determine if an investment is valued

appropriately. Each holding's P/E is the latest closing price divided by the latest fiscal year's earnings per

share. Negative P/E ratios are excluded from this calculation.

Price/Book (P/B): The price to book (P/B) value ratio is a fundamental measure used to determine if an investment is valued

appropriately. The book value of a company is a measure of how much a company's assets are worth assuming the company's debts are paid off. Each holding's P/B is the latest closing price divided by the latest

fiscal year's book value per share. Negative book values are excluded from this calculation.

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
